Take Me Home

Is someone one in your family at risk of being lost and confused. The Des Moines Police Department offers **Take Me Home**, a program designed to serve people with developmental disabilities and/or medical conditions that in-

crease their risk of wandering or becoming lost.

The **Take Me Home** registration form data and a photo provides police officers information to access when out on patrol and allows the officer to assist the person in returning home. And, when an individual is missing, the photo and description is readily available to assist police personnel search.
