MEETING:

1. Approval of the minutes from the meeting March 2, 2017: unanimously approved.
2. Red Light Enforcement Update: PD Commander Bob Bohls updated the Committee by summarizing the current violations captured at each location that has red light photo enforcement. Overall violations are decreasing each month, but it is still too early to tell how the violations will trend over time without a few more months of data. Staff will continue to update the Committee at a later date following additional data points.
3. SR-509 Update: Chief Operations Officer (COO) Dan Brewer informed the Committee that as part of the SR-509 Project, the Legislature is requiring 60 million dollars of the project funding come from the local agencies. Local agencies include cities, King County and the Port of Seattle relative to the SR-509 portion of the project. The Legislature is requesting that the local “partners” have at least a plan for the funding by the end of 2017. There will be follow-up meetings by the Project Executive Team and Steering Committee in the next months related to the potential options. There is no current funding identified in the Des Moines 6-year Capital Improvement Plan, nor would this be currently recommended by the PS&T Committee.
4. Sound Transit Update: COO Dan Brewer briefed the Committee that Sound Transit will soon be obtaining Board approval for the property acquisition phase which is scheduled to start in June. Property owners will likely be notified in the next couple of weeks of the

planned process. Sound Transit will be briefing the full Council with an update at the April 13 Council meeting.

5. Pacific Ridge Plan: City Attorney Tim George explained the Pacific Ridge Strategic Operations Plan will involve several Departments of the City in a collaborative effort to make improvements with respect to crime, quality of life and safety in that area and a presentation to the full Council will be given at the Council meeting that evening.
