The Puget Sound Gateway Program was funded as part of the Connecting Washington transportation package in 2015. The Gateway Program is comprised of two projects: the SR 509 and SR 167 Completion Projects.

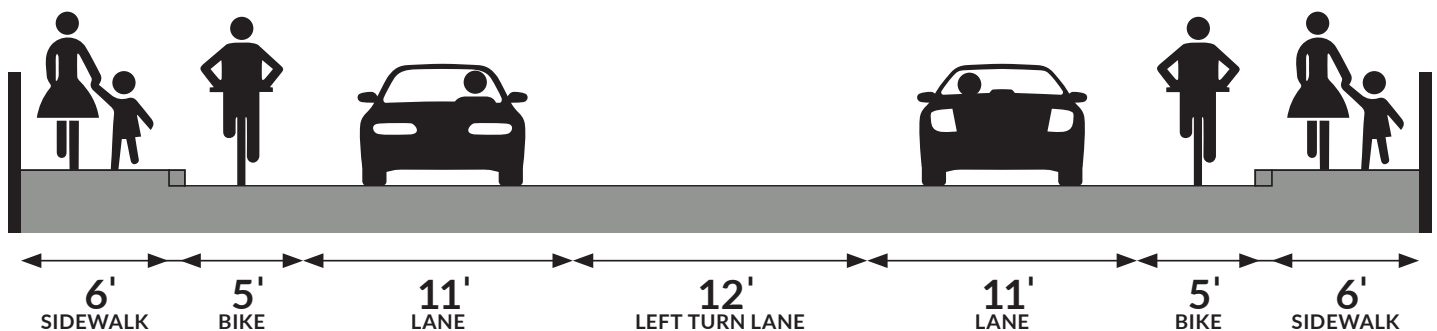
The SR 509 Completion Project will connect the Port of Seattle to major manufacturing and industrial centers in Kent, and create an important alternate route to I-5 in south King County.

As part of the SR 509 Completion Project, the S. 216th Bridge over I-5 will be reconstructed between late 2020 and early 2023.
